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MESSAGE FROM OUR CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER









Celebrating Culture, Connection and Community





Smiles All Round for World Emoji Day at Knockhall!


Knockhall Primary School marked <u>World Emoji Day</u> with a joyful and creative celebration full of emojithemed learning across the school.


Welcoming Educators for EdTech Study Tour


Their poems now sit proudly alongside entries from children across the UK, marking a huge achievement for our young writers and a moment they'll remember for years to come.

Year 5 Lead the Way in Sustainability Project


